Conservation and Restoration

West Valley Wetlands Tour showcases conservation project

Despite the cold and some ice on the ponds, 25 participants enjoyed an early spring tour on April 2 to observe migratory



waterfowl at the West Valley Wetlands conservation project – a 396-acre conservation project in progress that will include a public bird viewing area.

We saw more than 25 species, including common goldeneye, bufflehead, redhead, mallard, green-winged teal, canvasback, lesser scaup, northern pintail, western meadowlark, and mountain bluebird. We were treated with the sight of three sandhill cranes in addition to a bald eagle and rough-legged hawk interacting in flight. Flathead Land Trust, Flathead Audubon, and the West Valley Naturalist's Association sponsored the tour. A big thanks to Cory Davis, Gael Bissell, Rick Mace, and Bob Rost of Flathead Audubon for their bird expertise and help with the tour!

These partners will lead another birding tour on Saturday, May 13 during more spring-like conditions (see details under Events on page 2).
